



**KEDUTAAN BESAR REPUBLIK INDONESIA

Kedutaan Besar Republik Indonesia di Yangon menyampaikan salam hormatnya kepada Kementerian Luar Negeri Republik Uni Myanmar, Misi Diplomatik dan Konsuler serta Organisasi Internasional yang terakreditasi kepada Republik Uni Myanmar, bersama ini dengan hormat menyampaikan kebijakan baru dari Peraturan Presiden Republik Indonesia Nomor 21 tertanggal 2 Maret 2016 mengenai Bebas Visa Kunjungan.

Terkait hal ini, Kedubes Indonesia selanjutnya menginformasikan bahwa pemegang paspor, baik Diplomatik, Dinas maupun Biasa, yang berasal dari 169 negara (tercantum dalam Lampiran 1) dapat memasuki dan tinggal di wilayah Indonesia tanpa Visa selama 30 hari. Penting untuk menjadi perhatian bahwa fasilitas bebas Visa berlaku untuk perjalanan tunggal dan tidak memungkinkan untuk dilakukan perubahan ke jenis ijin tinggal lain atau diperpanjang. Jika membutuhkan masa tinggal di Indonesia lebih dari 30 hari, maka disarankan untuk tetap mengupayakan Visa Kunjungan pada Saat Kedatangan yang memberikan ijin tinggal selama 30 hari dan dapat diperpanjang 30 hari kemudian, atau mengajukan Visa Kunjungan Singkat lain di Perwakilan RI terdekat.

Lebih lanjut, Kedubes Indonesia juga menjelaskan bahwa fasilitas bebas visa kunjungan ini dapat dimanfaatkan untuk tujuan pariwisata, kunjungan keluarga, seni dan budaya, tugas pemerintahan, menghadiri seminar atau pelatihan, pameran, pertemuan dengan kantor pusat atau kantor perwakilan di Indonesia, serta singgah. Namun demikian, fasilitas ini tidak dapat digunakan untuk kepentingan bekerja, penempatan dan kunjungan jurnalistik.

Terkait dengan tempat masuk dan keluar dari wilayah Indonesia, Kedubes Indonesia menyampaikan bahwa warga asing dengan fasilitas bebas visa kunjungan hanya dapat masuk dan keluar melalui 29 bandar udara, 88 pelabuhan laut dan 7 perbatasan darat yang telah ditetapkan (tercantum pada lampiran 2).

Kedutaan Besar Republik Indonesia di Yangon mempergunakan kesempatan ini untuk sekali lagi menyampaikan penghargaan yang setinggi-tingginya kepada Misi Diplomatik dan Konsuler serta Organisasi Internasional yang terakreditasi kepada Republik Uni Myanmar.

The Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in Yangon presents its compliments to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, Diplomatic and Consular Missions and International Organizations accredited to the Republic of the Union of Myanmar and has the honour to convey the new policy from Presidential Regulation of the Republic of Indonesia Number 21 of 2016 on the Visit Visa Exemption dated March 02, 2016.

In this regard, the Embassy has further to inform that passport holder, Diplomatic, Official and Ordinary Passport, from 169 countries (shown in Annex 1) is eligible to enter and remain in Indonesia without visa for 30 days. It is important to notice that the visa exemption facility is for single entry journey and does not allow any extension or transfer into other kind of visa or permit. If the duration of stay in Indonesia is more than 30 days, it is advised to arrange Visa on Arrival which will be given for 30 days and extendable for another 30 days or apply appropriate short-term visit visa at the nearest Indonesian Embassy or Consulate.

Furthermore, the Embassy also would like to enlighten that the visa exemption facility is applied for tourism, family visit, arts and culture, governmental duty, attend seminar or workshop, exhibition, meeting with headquarter or representative office in Indonesia, and transit purposes. However, it does not eligible for working, posting or journalist visit.

Regarding the entry and exit points, the Embassy has the honour to notify that foreigners who apply visa exemption facility may enter and exit only through designated 29 airports, 88 seaports and 7 land borders (shown in Annex 2).
